

# New lockdown rules for England

Main restrictions from Tuesday 5 January



Stay home - only leave for work, essential shopping, exercise or medical appointments



Exercise allowed outdoors once a day, in your local area. You can exercise with your household, support bubble, or one other person



Schools closed except for vulnerable children and children of critical workers. Universities and colleges closed



No household mixing indoors or outdoors unless in your support or childcare bubble



Non-essential shops, leisure and entertainment venues closed



Pubs and restaurants closed, but takeaway food permitted

#### **PANDEMIC GRANTS**

If someone has been told by NHS Test and Trace Service that they must self-isolate and stay at home then they may be eligible for a £500 **Test and Trace Support Payment** to help financially during their isolation period.

For the most vulnerable households that have been affected by the pandemic and are struggling to pay for food or other essential bills there are discretionary funds available including an **Emergency Fund** made available through DEFRA and a **Winter Grant Scheme** funded through the Department for Work & Pensions to help those residents in Shropshire that are most in need. Between them, these funds will be able to help the most vulnerable with the cost of food, energy and water bills and other essential outgoings.

## **Heart of Wales Line - Rail Service Update**

The UK rail industry's winter timetable change came into effect on Sunday 13 December. On the Transport for Wales network there are a number of changes to departure times to provide customers with more consistency moving forward.

Rail services on the northern section of the Heart of Wales Line, between Shrewsbury and Llandrindod/Llanwrtyd, have seen an increase from two services a day in each direction to four services a day in each direction.

Hopton Heath will continue to be omitted from the timetable as Covid-19 risk assessments identified several stations across the network where, due to short platform lengths, it is not possible to maintain a safe distance between the conductor and customers. A "dial-a-cab" option will remain available to passengers at this station.

The onward passenger journey to Swansea is supported by a rail replacement bus service whilst Network Rail continue to

restore the railway following the freight derailment. The rail service will reinstated once this work is completed, although TfW are still facing challenges as a result of Covid-19 and will release further timetable information as the work at Llangennech progresses.
