

Reproduced by permission of Election Maps, Ordinance Survey Sources in Shropshire Council have told us that a number of their key grant pots for dealing with the Covid Crisis will be closing in the coming week. These include: The Small Business Grant and the Retail, Hospitality and Leisure Grant.

Nigel Hartin said: "The Covid-19 grant schemes are likely to come to an end soon, so if there are any businesses in the area that have a business rates rating, but have not yet applied for the grant, now really is the time for them to get an application in as soon as possible. It's very straightforward to apply!"

Most businesses and organisations running community buildings can apply for one or other of these grants. Apply via https://shropshire.gov.uk/covid-19-grants.



Nigel concluded: "These are grants that won't have to be paid back and can be used: to meet lost income; to alter business premises to meet Covid-19 restrictions or to explore a new arm to the business. Even if businesses have remained open through the last 4 months you can still apply.

"The restrictions around Covid 19 will remain for some time so even if your losses are small so far, these could well grow in the coming months and the grant could help you through this period too."

LY A FEW DAYS LEFT TO **VOTE FOR Sparc Grant**

The Save the SpArC charity was shortlisted 4 weeks ago to get £5,000 from Calor Community Fund and £2,000 from Crowdfunding to install a simple café.

Now, in the last few days of the voting process, the charity is so grateful to everyone that has supported them so far. Pledges of over £2,375 have been received which, together with the £3,000 donated previously, means we can match-fund the Calor bid.

The challenge now is to get enough points to be short-listed by Calor. Currently ranked 10th but have been as low as 13 and as high as 6. 11 projects will gain £5,000, so it's tense because all projects will be drumming up support.

Please can everyone who supports the café idea now pull out the stops? Even if you have pledged before, can you click on like, and can you persuade friends and relatives to do the same? Voters do not need to be SpArC users, or even live in Europe. The only rule is one vote per email address.

Shropshire Council Charges Re-Introduced

Parking charges are set to be reintroduced in Shropshire Council's town centre car parks from 14 July.

The majority of car parks parking will remain free on Sundays and bank holidays. Parking will also remain free in car parks where no charge was previously made such as in Clun.

Charges in all car parks were suspended in March 2020 in response to the coronavirus pandemic,

Shropshire Council's Administration this week confirmed that: "Shropshire Council will continue to take forward the North West Relief Road in its current form."

The project will cost an estimated £71 million, £54 million of which has been raised so far.

There does not necessarily need to be a direct link to the pandemic. The group will also need to state what the money will be used for and how this benefits the local community
