CLUN BRIDGE CLOSURE



Urgent repair works will mean that Clun Bridge will be closed between 7th and 11th December.

The repair works will involve taking down and rebuilding two areas of displaced parapet following impact damage.

STAR NEWSAGENTS

Over the past few months, the main objective of the Bishop's Castle Community Land Trust (BCCLT) has been to secure a future for the former Stars Newsagent at 68-70 Church Street. The Trust tried to get Shropshire Council to take out a compulsory purchase order on the building without success. However, an online petition has attracted over 300 responses and many supportive comments which will continue to be used in the dialogue with Shropshire Council.

The aim is to create two units of affordable housing above, and to use part of the ground floor for a community resource centre, to provide a 'shop window' and focal point for a range of local and community initiatives, such as Grow Local.

The Middle Marches Community Land Trust

The Trust was launched in April 2019, to provide a vehicle for the local ownership of land that can provide a haven for wildlife, better connectivity between habitats; promote regenerative agriculture and stimulate local food production.

Since then, the main achievements have been:
Working with the Stretton Wetlands
Interest group on an appeal to buy a three-acre
field on the edge of Church Stretton. It hosts 141
plant species, and 45 different types of insects,


Obtaining a 7 acre site just North of Bishops Castle, which has not been intensively managed for over 12 years. Part of the ground will be fenced off to allow for brief periods of mobgrazing to break up the turf and allow more plants to germinate. The rest will be rewilded.

Buying 94 acres up on Norbury Hill (below). The £100k was raised in a very short space of time from local donors. Securing it means that Norbury Hill will become the largest 'Stepping Stone' for nature between the Long Mynd and Stiperstones.

The Trust's first General Meeting will be held in January, when a full Board will be formally elected.
