Between 23–27 Dec 2020, you may travel between tiers and other nations of the UK to meet with your Christmas bubble.



**Christmas Bubbles** 

Between 23 and 27 December, the three households in a "Christmas bubble" can mix indoors and stay overnight.

People who have formed a bubble, will be allowed to meet each other:

- In each other's homes
- At a place of worship
- In an outdoor public space, or garden

The bubbles will be fixed, so you will not be able to mix with two households on Christmas Day and two different ones on Boxing Day. Households in your Christmas bubble can't bubble with anyone else. If a person has coronavirus symptoms or is selfisolating, then they cannot join a bubble. **For more information about forming a Christmas bubble with friends and family, follow this link** -



# **New Investment at Bishop's Castle Business Park**

After many years of campaigning by local Lib Dem Councillors there is finally good news on the future of Bishop's Castle Business Park.

Funding of £4.3 million has been secured to expand the Park by 50,000 square feet, which is great news for local businesses wishing to expand and for new ones ,to secure modern purpose-built business accommodation.

Bishop's Castle Business Park is owned by Shropshire Council and has stood as an under-used employment and industrial space for over 10 years. This is now about to change with this investment,  $\pounds$ 1.7 million of which is from the European Regional Development Fund, with a further  $\pounds$ 3.1million allocated by Shropshire Council.

The investment is in this site is long overdue: it was first identified over 10 years ago as an essential development needed in the area to enable existing businesses to expand and to support new businesses needing smaller start up units. Former Liberal Democrat Councillors for Bishop's Castle, Peter Phillips, Charlotte Barnes and Jonny Keeley all campaigned hard to raise awareness of this site to secure inward investment and the development of this important economic resource for the local area.



Bishop's Castle Councillor Ruth Houghton says "Since being elected in September 2019 I have made sure that the development of this site has remained firmly on the Shropshire Council agenda and used my first full Shropshire Council meeting to make my maiden speech in support of this much needed development and investment in our community".

Planning permission has already been approved enabling work on the site to begin in the Spring, with a planned opening date of Spring 2022. Site clearance has already started. The development will consist of two 15,000sqft units and two 10,000sqft units, one of which will be split into five starter units, giving new businesses the chance to take up premises.

Cllr Nigel Hartin added "It is really good to see that long-awaited development of Bishop's Castle Business Park is all set to go ahead in 2021. This will be a much-needed boost to the for the economy of the whole area. I hope that this will provide training and modern apprenticeship opportunities for our young people seeking local jobs"

## **ACTION ON BUCKNELL FLOOD PREVENTION**

Nigel Hartin and Jonathan Kemp from Bucknell Parish Council held a virtual meeting last week with officers from the Environment Agency about future plans for work on the River Redlake following their walk around in the village earlier in the year.

Nigel said: "This was in response in part to concerns I had received from residents about build-up of silt under church bridge (left) next to the post office.

"The Agency have commissioned a major study of the River Redlake Catchment Area from consultants ARUP, (one of the first to be so commissioned in the County) with a timescale for study work to be started early in the New Year. "This is good news but we really need some actual dredging action now rather than later on next year so I have been in contact with Shropshire Council's Flood and Drainage Manager, John Bellis. Although the EA is responsible for clearing the main river, as far as the bridges themselves are concerned it's actually the 'riparian owner', which is Shropshire Council, who has to carry out any de-silting works under bridges after consulting with the Environment Agency!"
