

RETURN OF CCTV ON CLUN BRIDGE URGENT



Nigel Hartin, Shropshire Councillor for Clun Division, is urging Shropshire to prioritise the repair and return the CCTV camera on the classic bridge at Clun before it is damaged again.

Nigel said "This ancient bridge has been repeatedly damaged over the years by HGVs ignoring all the signs and trying to squeeze across its mediaeval structure. Although its deterrence value is limited it has allowed the Council to trance some of the perpetrators and seek compensation.

"Shropshire took the camera away a few weeks ago and we have not heard anything since. The Town Council and myself have sent a further reminder recently but no response as yet but we will keep chasing until its return!"

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Despite pressure from many residents, voluntary groups and the Lib Dems on the Council, the Administration at Shropshire Council failed to join the large number of Councils across the UK providing free school meal vouchers to ALL eligible families over the half term holiday.

Nigel said: "The impact of COVID has hit many families hard financially and some are struggling to make ends meet. The Government's attitude to free school meals has been utterly shameful and pressure must be put on them to fund free school meals over the Christmas break. Failing that Shropshire Council must come good on the commitment it made last week and fund school meals for all entitled families over the next school holidays."

NEWS FROM SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL

Libraries: As of Thursday, libraries will be expected to close except for any click and collect type service.

Household waste recycling centres: At this point they are not expecting waste and recycling services to be listed as one of the non-essential services that should close. These can therefore remain open. As always, the decision on whether to open a recycling centre rests with the individual local authority, taking into account the safety of staff and managing the risks on a site-by-site basis.

Outside and farmers markets: MHCLG has clarified that traders selling essential items can continue to trade.

Caravan parks: These can stay open if accommodating people as their primary residence.

Financial help during the November Lockdown in England:

The Furlough scheme at 80% is extended to December.

Grants of up to £3,000 per month for premises that are forced to close. See below.

<u>Business Closure Grants</u> – Grants of up to £3k are to be paid where there is a business closure. The banding of support is as follows –

☐ Properties with a rateable value of £15k or under = £1,334 per month

☐ Properties with a rateable value of between £15k to £51k = £2,000 per month

Properties with a rateable value of £51k or over = £3,000 per month

Self-employed:

To reflect the recent changes to the furlough scheme, the UK-wide Self-Employment Income Support Scheme (SEISS) will be made more generous – with self-employed individuals receiving 80% of their average trading profits for November.

And to ensure those who need support get it as soon as possible, payments will also be made more quickly with the claims window being brought forward from 14 December to 30 November.
